

I saw three porcelain poodles, for sale for twenty-five cents. I asked how much was just one of the small ones but they said they were selling all three together. So, I crossed back across the street and asked my mom for another dime (not the last time I would be asking her for money). I purchased the three poodles, and gave them to her as a present. She kept it for all these years on her dresser and after her passing, I now keep the trio front and center in my display case. I did a little research and was astounded at what I discovered, "Spaghetti Poodles" were a VERY big thing in the 50s. Where were they produced? JAPAN! Yes, Japan. With a nickname like "Spaghetti" you might be inclined to think Italy, after WWII, Japan was desperate


to begin economic recovery and would make anything that was selling. In the 50s, poodles were the chic item to have. Owning a poodle was the quintessential show of elite-ness, and displaying anything poodle was just the "In" thing to do. Spaghetti poodles were mostly small, about an inch and a half to two inches high, and came in a variety of colors and poses. They were called spaghetti because of the fluffy protrusions that resembled strands of the tasty pasta. Today, these canines are quite collectable, ranging in price from \$20 to several hundred on eBay. Next time you are at a garage sale and see a small porcelain poodle, take a look, it might be a valuable item or just another pet.











Louis Wormser started in a small way in San Francisco in the year 1850 and later was joined by his brother Isaac in 1856. After 23 years, they sold out to Messrs. Braeg and Frank.

Throughout their ownership, the Wormser Bros. not only sold whiskey, but also sold and distributed bitters. Their bitters as well as their whiskey flasks are in great demand. Their whiskey flasks consist of one embossed horizontally in a semi-circle, ie., Wormser Bros. in semi-circle and horizontally San Francisco. The other two were embossed vertically Wormser Bros. San Francisco. The difference is in the roll collar. Another flask exists that is embossed vertically Wormser Bros. and the reverse Fine Old Cognac.






